**Appointments, Promotion and Tenure Committee (3 Year Term):** The COM-Tucson Faculty will elect the Appointments, Promotion and Tenure Committee, which will include a minimum of **three (3) tenured full professors**. Additional tenured professors and non-tenure eligible professors may be added to expand committee knowledge about criteria for promotion on the clinical, research and educator tracks. Per UHAP 3.3.02, in promotion or tenure matters, recommendations will be made only by faculty members holding rank superior to the rank of the faculty member being considered, except in the case of full professors, where recommendations can only be made by faculty members holding the same rank. The same will apply to faculty title series. Only tenured members of the Committee may vote on issues concerning tenure track Faculty. This Committee will review and advise the Dean regarding each proposed Faculty appointment, promotion, or award of tenure.

**Educational Policy Committee and Subcommittees (3 Year Term):** *The Educational Policy Committee for the College of Medicine-Tucson will consist of 12 faculty and 4 medical students. The faculty will be elected from the College of Medicine and serve for 3 years with one renewable term. The students will elect four students representing their class year for 4-year terms. The Educational Policy Committee will work with the Dean, Deputy Dean and COM Administration to provide governance and oversight of the undergraduate medical curriculum, to advance educational goals and to make sure the College meets its accreditation standards. The committee will develop policies for student performance and advancement, and criteria to receive an M.D. degree. The Educational Policy Committee will generally meet at least once per month to evaluate the present curriculum and educational experience and develop changes in the educational and curricular policy as needed.*

The Honor Code Committee will recommend disciplinary action up to and including dismissal; the Deputy Dean, Education will make a final decision based on the recommendation. The Honor Code Committee also will conduct a periodic review of the Honor Code Policy and make recommendations to change the Policy.*

**Student Progress Committee (3 Year Term for faculty, 4 Year Term for students):** *The COM -- TUCSON Faculty will elect its own members to the Student Progress Committee, which will consist of at least eight (8) Faculty members, and one (1) student from each of its classes. The Student Progress Committee will have jurisdiction to review and monitor the academic progress of students; grant non-medical leaves of absence; review the performance or professional conduct of any student brought to the Committee's attention by a faculty member or administrator; recommend remedial action to improve student performance; recommend a student be placed on academic probation; and recommend a student be dismissed for academic or conduct-based reasons. The Student Progress Committee will conduct a hearing if a student is recommended for dismissal for conduct reasons and will make a recommendation to the Deputy Dean, Education. Current society mentors, block directors, clerkship directors, and any faculty member whose participation on this Committee would constitute a conflict of interest, are not eligible to serve on this Committee.*

**Faculty Diversity Advisory Committee (FDAC) (4 Year Term):** *The Faculty Diversity Advisory Committee (FDAC) is a standing committee which: 1) identifies strategies, tactics and priorities for improving faculty diversity and inclusivity at the COM; 2) assists in determining how to integrate diversity and inclusion, broadly defined, into everything we do at the college; 3) provides a line of communication between faculty and administration; and 4) supports development and implementation of programs related to diversity, equity, and inclusion that enhance faculty life (related to career development, mentoring, leadership, community outreach, etc.). The committee interacts closely with similar committees for students, staff and other groups. The FDAC is co-chaired by two of the members of the FDAC. The College of Medicine Deans for Faculty Development and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion serve as ex-officio members. The FDAC is comprised of 10 faculty members who will serve four-year terms. The FDAC will meet monthly. The work of the FDAC will be supported by the College of Medicine Offices of Faculty Affairs and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Members must be on the faculty at the UA College of Medicine at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full Professor. Additional individuals from staff/student diversity committees or the community may be invited to serve as liaisons on the FDAC. Membership should include representation from multiple departments and centers, all ranks and all tracks. It is expected that the committee will be diverse as defined by the COM Diversity Statement, and will include both UA employed and affiliate faculty.*
